#### **ABSENTEE BALLOT:**



All absentee ballots must be postmarked 1 day before the election (November 4).

The theme for Fire Prevention Week 2024 is "Smoke alarms: Make them work for you!" The week will take place from October 6-12, 2024.

The theme's goal is to educate everyone about the importance of having working smoke alarms in their homes.

The key safety tips for 2024 Fire Prevention Week:

**INSTALL**—Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area (like a hallway) and on each level (including the basement) of the home.

**TEST**—Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.

**REPLACE**—Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or stop responding when tested.

#### Wheatland's Fire Procedures

In the event of a fire all residents should remain in their apartment unless:

- The fire is in your apartment
- An immediate evacuation is advised by management or emergency personnel

#### If the fire is in your apartment:

- Leave your apartment immediately, close the door tight (do not lock)
- Pull the nearest fire alarm located in the hallway

#### If the fire is in a public area:

- Remain in your apartment unless an immediate evacuation is advised by management or an emergency personnel
- Close all doors and windows
- Keep all telephone lines clear
- Stay in your apartment until further notice is given
- The appropriate staff or Fire Department will let you know when all is clear

Our residents are our top priority! The most important thing to do is to **REMAIN CALM.** 

If the alarm in your apartment begins to chirp, it may mean the batteries are running low and need to be replaced. Call the maintenance department to report this and they will change your batteries. If it continues to chirp, call maintenance again as it may be time to replace the alarm.

October 2 an annular solar eclipse will occur. It's an upcoming celestial event that has captured the attention of astronomy enthusiasts worldwide. The moon will pass before the sun during this eclipse, creating a "ring of fire" effect in the sky.

The eclipse will be visible in Grand Forks with approximately 59% of the sun covered. It will start at 12:51 pm and end at 3:08 pm with the maximum coverage at 2:00 pm.

If you plan to watch the eclipse, be sure to wear the appropriate eye protection.


